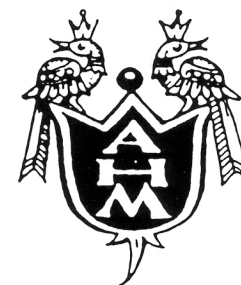
In 2004 she won the Alpe Adria International Violoncello Competition in Gorizia, Italy.

In 2007 she placed first at the Beethoven Chamber Music Competition, London, UK.

In 2010 she was selected among the best 13 cellist at the 5th Unisa International String competition in South Africa.

She participated in the master courses of Ralph Kirshbaum, Tsuyoshi Tsutsumi, Philippe Muller, Guido Schiefen, Alberto Portugheis, Martin Lovett, Déri György and Gulyás Márta. She plays the baroque cello as well, she is a member of Camerata Hungarica early music ensemble and a permanent guest of Mandel Quartet. She received scholarship last year to complete her study with Nick Tzavaras of the Shanghai Quartet at the Montclair State University, USA.

In 2010 February she was selected for the Tanglewood Summer Music Festival.

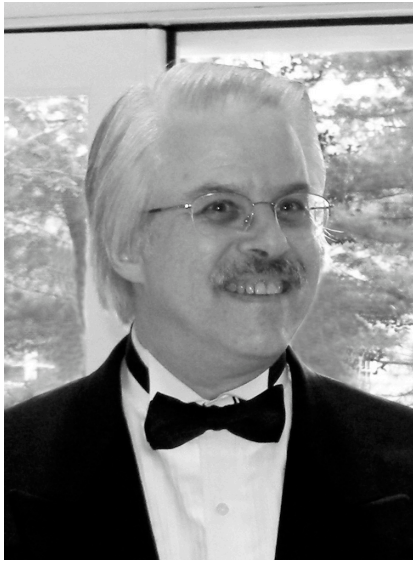
